

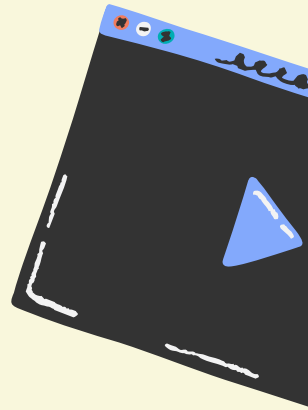

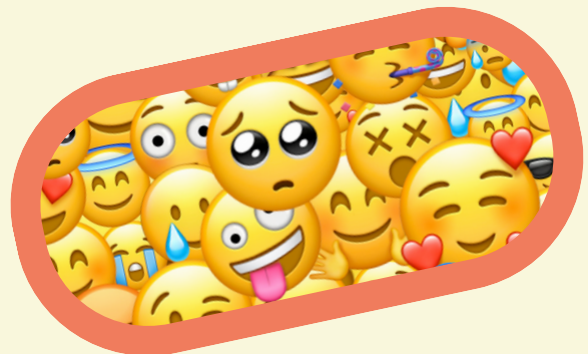

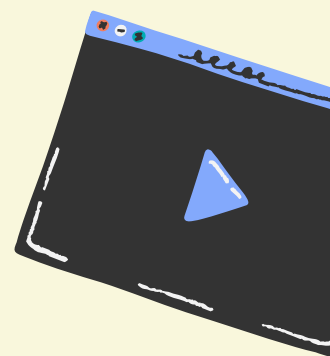

Sat. Evening: Public Performance

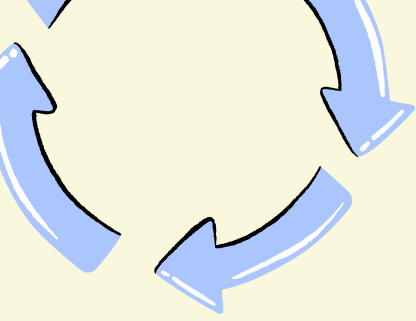


Explanation:
